The Center for Autism and Neurodevelopmental Disorders (CANDO) is a collaboration between UMass Memorial Medical Center and the Eunice Kennedy Shriver Center at the University of Massachusetts Medical School. Offering a variety of services for youth and adults who have complex emotional and behavioral challenges in combination with an autism or neurodevelopmental disorder, our goals are to:

- Provide stabilization for our patients through diagnostic clarification and short-term treatment
- Assist families in accessing support
- Help families navigate the transition of care back to community providers

Our services are available to families, schools and agencies, both within the US and internationally, and are billable via insurance or self-pay options.

WELCOME TO CANDO CLINICS

AUTISM AND NEURODEVELOPMENTAL DISORDERS CLINIC

Our clinic offers diagnostic and medication evaluations, and short-term treatment of psychiatric disorders in youth who are on the autism spectrum or have other complex neurodevelopmental disorders.

SERVICES INCLUDE:

Interdisciplinary Team Evaluation

Our team makes treatment recommendations following an in-depth review of past and current symptoms, and treatments and services, in addition to performing psychiatric, occupational therapy and speech-language evaluations.

Short-term Treatment

Following evaluations, short-term treatment options may be offered in the form of medication, and occupational therapy and speech-language treatment. Recommendations may be made for further testing, including neuropsychological, genetic, sleep, nutrition, hearing, vision, school testing, etc.

Subspecialty Psychiatric Clinics

Our team provides recommendations through a thoughtful, comprehensive diagnostic assessment and treatment planning, including consultation for medication treatment, psychotherapy, behavioral therapies, educational supports, and home- or community-based resources.

Subspecialty Psychiatric Clinics Include:

- **Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorders (ADHD) Clinic**

The ADHD Clinic offers a psychiatric evaluation for those in need of diagnostic evaluation and treatment recommendations.

- **Fragile X Behavioral Health Clinic**

The Fragile X Clinic offers diagnostic and medication consultations as needed, occupational therapy and speech-language evaluations, and short-term treatment.

- **Mood and Psychotic Disorders Clinic**

This clinic offers a psychiatric evaluation for those in need of diagnostic evaluation and treatment recommendations.



SELF-PAY OPTIONS

Families, schools and agencies now can access expanded CANDO services through a self-pay option. In addition to patients living within the US, these services also are available to international patients.

SELF-PAY SERVICES INCLUDE:

Neurodevelopmental and Complex Psychiatric Disorders

This service caters to patients with complex neurodevelopmental disorders, including autism and Fragile X, and complex psychiatric disorders, such as mood and psychotic disorders. We provide a comprehensive evaluation or second opinion/consultation in cases when the patient, family and/or treatment team is seeking diagnostic clarification and treatment recommendations. This service includes:

- An in-depth review of an individual's current and past symptoms
- A detailed examination of prior treatments and services
- A review of caregiver and patient-completed symptom forms (completed prior to the appointment)
- An evaluation conducted over two or more visits with appropriate specialists

Occupational Therapy and Speech-language Therapy

Several personalized therapy services are available. Options include:

- Review of Individual Education Plan (IEP), school and community provider records
- Attendance at a school/program meeting to share CANDO evaluation results and treatment recommendations
- School and home observation of the patient
- Parent/family and/or provider training

FUNDING THE CANDO CLINIC

LEND GRANT

The CANDO Clinic is funded in part by the Leadership in Education in Neurodevelopmental and Related Disabilities (LEND) Program. LEND is a grant provided by the Maternal Child Health Bureau that supports training for psychiatry; family medicine, developmental and behavioral pediatrics, and other providers through participation in clinic services and other teachings.
