

Dr. Christopher Marshall Named to Medical Group Board of Trustees

Joining the faculty in 2011, he has practiced in various clinical roles across the system, including the Medical Center; HealthAlliance-Clinton Hospital, Clinton Campus; Marlborough Hospital and Harrington Hospital. He is active at the Medical School, not only teaching both GI physiology and nutrition, but also serving as a course director and mentor, having received the Educational Achievement Star Award on multiple occasions. As Clinical Chief he has committed to faculty and leadership to expand services across the health system to meet the needs of our patients and caregivers. He supports his faculty as clinical innovators as they deliver quality care and help develop new clinical programs.

Dr. Marshall's passion is academic medicine and he sees the vital role academic clinicians play in the development and recruitment of the future leaders in medicine.
